

2024 Jackson/Nemaha Bullmasters' Shooting Sports State Qualifier – Trap & Skeet



August 10, 2024—Capital City Gun Club 12200 SW 4th St. Topeka, KS

The Jackson/Nemaha Bullmasters will be hosting a shooting sports match for shotgun. This match is a state qualifier. All levels of shooters are invited to participate from 4-H age 10 to 18.

NOTE: the minimum age to participate at the State Match 10 years old by Jan. 1, 2024

Registration forms are due by Saturday, August 2. Late registrations only accepted to fill relays. Fees are \$20 per game per shooter. We will only accept registration from one person per county. Registration will begin at 7:30 a.m.- each county needs to verify their shooter's information when checking in for correct age and games being shot. Payment will be due at onsite registration.

TRAP: Shooters will shoot 50 targets, 2 rounds of 25 and the qualifying score is 35 out of the possible 50. The break between rounds of 25 will only be long enough to retrieve a new box of shells. We will need volunteers to help score. We will follow the current Kansas State Shooting Sports rules and current ATA Trap rules. **No resting of barrels on toes**.

Skeet: Shooters will shoot 50 clays, 2 rounds of 25 and the qualifying score is 30 out of a possible 50. The break between rounds of 25 will only be long enough to retrieve a new box of shells. We will need volunteers to assist with pulling and scoring. We plan to use 2 skeet fields. We will follow the current Kansas State Shooting Sports rules and current NSSA rules. **No resting of barrels on toes**.

A shooter must qualify in <u>EITHER</u> trap or skeet to shoot sporting clays at the state match. A shooter <u>MUST</u> shoot trap, skeet <u>AND</u> sporting clays at the state match to be considered for the National team.

There will NOT be awards or a concession stand.
