

## 2024 Jackson/Nemaha Bullmasters' Shooting Sports State Qualifier – Small Bore Pistol & Rifle



August 17, 2024—Horton Sport Shooting Complex Kingfisher Rd. and Highway 20, Horton, KS 66439

The Jackson/Nemaha Bullmasters will be hosting a shooting sports match for small bore pistol & rifle. This match is a state qualifier. All levels of shooters are invited to participate from 4-H age 12 to 18.

NOTE: the minimum age to participate at the State Match 12 years old by Jan. 1, 2024

Registration forms are due by Saturday, August 10. Late registrations only accepted to fill relays. Fees are \$10 per discipline. We will only accept registration from one person per county. Registration will begin 8:00 a.m. - each county needs to verify their shooter's information when checking in for correct age and disciplines being shot. The match will begin at 9:00 a.m. State qualifying rules will be observed in each of the disciplines. Check the State 4-H Shooting Sports website for all qualifying rules. There will be no awards. Fees will be collected at onsite registration. There will not be a concession stand.

<u>Small Bore Pistol:</u> Shooters will shoot the following course of fire: 25 yards range distance: Slow Fire – B16 target; 10 minutes for 10 shots. Timed Fire – B8 target, 20 seconds per string of 5, 2 strings of 5. Rapid Fire – B8 target, 10 seconds per string of 5, 2 strings of 5. To qualify for the State Match, the minimum individual score is 125 out of 300 possible.

<u>Small Bore Rifle</u>: Shooters will shoot the following course of fire: Orion Smallbore Rifle Targets: Shoot 3x10 course of fire at 50 yards to include 10 shots in each position; prone (1 minute per record shot -10 minutes), standing (2 minutes per record shot -20 minutes), and kneeling (1.5 minutes per record shot -15 minutes). Targets will be changed after each position. To qualify for the State Match, the minimum individual score is 175 out of 300 possible.
